



Double Key Tassel

Finished Tassel Size: 6"

Materials:

Main Color – Red Heart *Soft* (Claret) – 1 ounce
(27 grams, 38 yards)

Crochet hook size: G (4.0mm) or size needed for gauge

3" wide cardboard

4" wide cardboard

Gauge: 5 sc = 1 inch

Tassel Bell

With MC, ch 5 **loosely**; join with slip st to form ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, 10 sc in ring; join with slip st in first sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, **working in front loops only**, * (sc, hdc, sc) in next sc, slip st in next sc; repeat from * **4 times more**; join with slip st in first sc.

Rnd 3: (**Right side**) Ch 1, **working in back loops only of Rnd 1**, slip st in next sc, ch 1, sc in same st and each sc around; join with slip st in first sc.

NOTE* Loop a short piece of yarn around any stitch to mark last rnd as **right** side.

Rnd 4: Ch 1, *(insert hook into next sc, draw up loop, insert hook in next sc, draw up another loop, YO, draw through 3 loops on hook), sc in next sc; repeat from * **2 times more**; skip last sc, join with slip st in first sc: 6 st.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with slip st in first sc.

Rnd 6-7: Ch 1, sc in each sc around; join with slip st in first sc.

Rnd 8: Ch 1, **working in front loops only**, 2 sc in each sc around; join with slip st in first sc.

Rnd 9: Ch 1, (sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc) **6 times**; join with slip st in first sc.

Rnd 10-12: Ch 1, sc in each sc around; join with slip st in first sc: 18 sc.

Rnd 13: Ch 1, *sc in next 2 sc, (insert hook in next sc, draw up loop, insert hook in next sc, draw up another loop, YO, draw through 3 loops on hook); repeat from * **3 times more**; sc in last 2 sc; join with slip st in first sc. Finish off.

3" Tassel

Loosely wrap MC around 3" wide piece of cardboard **60 times**. Cut threads to finish off wrapping.

Cut piece of MC, insert one end **behind** tassel threads on one side of cardboard. Pull cut piece to edge of cardboard and tie a knot in cut piece, securing tassel threads. Cut strings free on opposite side of cardboard, forming tassel fringe. Trim tassel fringe to make even.

4" Tassel

Loosely wrap MC around 4" wide piece of cardboard **60 times**. Cut thread loose to finish off wrapping.

Cut 80" piece of MC. Insert one end of cut piece behind threads on one side of cardboard and pull through until both loose ends are 40" each. Pull to edge of cardboard and tie knot in cut piece, securing tassel threads. Cut strings free on opposite end of cardboard, forming tassel fringe.

Finishing

Assembly

Place 3" tassel on top of 4" tassel, tying knot in 40" loose ends to secure smaller tassel on top of larger one. Insert hook into center of beg 5-ch ring of bell and draw both 40" loose ends through top of tassel bell. Pull ends until bell wraps snugly around tassel. * Insert hook again into center of beg 5-ch ring and punch through top row to outside of bell. Draw up loop with one of 40" loose ends. Work chain **tightly** to end, leaving only 2 inches unworked. Finish off. Repeat from * **once more**. Tie ends together. Weave in ends. Trim 4" tassel to make fringes even. Double check 3" tassel fringes to insure they are straight and even. Retrim if necessary.

hdc	half double crochet(s)
MC	Main Color

Gauge

Gauge mentioned at the beginning of pattern instructions may need adjusting, depending upon your needle, deviation from type of yarn suggested, or other factors. Make an example piece and measure, then adjust needle size to obtain gauge.

Weaving In Ends

Ends can be woven in securely by loading loose end into yarn needle, pull loaded needle through a few stitches, then back in the other direction a few stitches. Cut yarn close to work.

Important note

Great strides have been taken to insure accuracy of patterns. Work may vary depending upon human error or individuality of work. Patterns have been made and instructions have been tested to insure accuracy.
